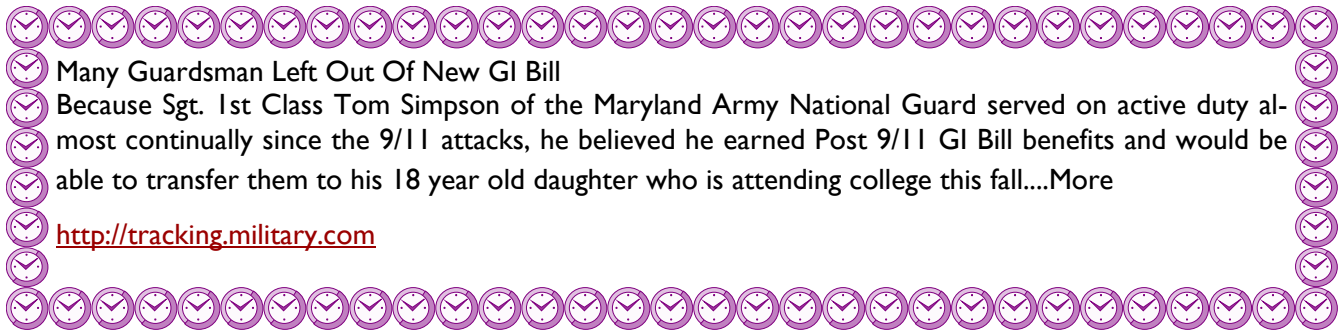

MEMBERSHIP

Annual Members, 632.

Lifetime Membership Committee records through grace period of January 31, 2009 indicated a grand total of 669: 447 Active Lifetime Members, 97 Deceased Lifetime Members, 12 Divorced, 6 Ineligible, and 107 Not reported.

A recommendation will be made to increase the lifetime membership fee from \$15 to \$25 if a member is 60 years of age or older. There will also be a recommendation that starting January 01, 2010 any eligible person who applies for lifetime membership in the EANGUS Auxiliary MUST BE the spouse of a person who already has a lifetime membership in EANGUS.

Associate Members, 438.

On-line memberships have increased.

Membership Co-Chairman Dianne Williams has uploaded membership data to EANGUS database. She and Membership Co-Chairman Sheila Bandy have sent access codes to state presidents or points of contact.

COMMITTEES

Proposed constitutional amendments were submitted to the President and the President passed them on to the Constitution Committee chaired by Virginia Ericson (AZ). The Constitution Committee did not recommend any amendments this year.

Connie Myers (MS) continued to encourage grassroots participation in the legislative process. Plans were ongoing to have an EANGUS member or staff person speak to the EANGUS Auxiliary during the Tuesday Auxiliary general membership session.

Scholarship application and information was printed in two issues of *The Signal*. Marie Brabham (FL) continued to serve as Scholarship Committee Chairman. The EANGUS Auxiliary is especially appreciative to USAA for their continued support of the Auxiliary Scholarship Program.

An Ad Hoc Committee was formed by President Taylor to pinpoint methods to involve younger spouses in the EANGUS Auxiliary. Members of the Committee are Rheanna Bernard (NV), Terry Irons (UT), and Connie Myers (MS). Strategies to recruit junior members and a questionnaire was in the May issue of *The Signal*. Please respond if you haven't already done so.

WAYS & MEANS PROJECTS

Silent Auction at Conference in Rochester, Minnesota. Members/States were encouraged to bring items for the Silent Auction. Hazel Holt (NC) continues to Chair the Silent Auction for the EANGUS Auxiliary.

Dessert Cookbooks—300 copies of the Auxiliary Dessert Cookbook are available for purchase at Conference. Sara Hendricks (IA/NM) is Chair of this Committee. She and President Taylor have already sold 73 cookbooks at various events. Cookbooks are selling for five dollars (\$5.00) each. The next in the series will be the Main Dish Cookbook.

The EANGUS Auxiliary continues to collect pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House (RMH). There will be someone from the local RMH at the EANGUS Auxiliary General Membership Meeting on Wednesday, August 12 to receive the Auxiliary's donation. Since every bag check with the airline now costs \$15 I decided not to carry pop tabs to Rochester, instead selling my pop tabs at home and sending my check to the EANGUS Auxiliary treasurer. Thanks, as always, was expressed to the entire EANGUS staff, led by Executive Director Mike Cline and Chief of Staff Bryan Birch and to the EANGUS President Frank Lever and the EANGUS Officers and Directors for every *Side by Side* action that helped the Auxiliary to be a true partner to EANGUS.

Delores Ford – at home with the Lord

Although not a charter member of the Mississippi Auxiliary, Delores joined and became an active member upon her marriage to Bob a couple of years after the Auxiliary was formed.

Delores served as Mississippi National Guard NCO Association Auxiliary President in 1976-1977. Her year is remembered for several reasons: a high membership of 409; half page ad purchased in the *Magnolia Non-Com*; her conference pre-registration program; a charter presented to the Gulfport Air Guard Local Auxiliary; and a \$500.00 donation to the scholarship fund.

In 1978 Delores was elected as Area IV Director for the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) Auxiliary and served until her election as national president at the 9th National EANGUS Conference in Nashville, Tennessee; she served as the EANGUS Auxiliary President from 1982 to 1984.

Delores and Louise Murphy made a quilt in 1979, proceeds of which were used to purchase souvenirs for the EANGUS Auxiliary conference for 2 years. Delores and Agnes Tupman assisted Mississippi Auxiliary president Vivian Taylor in making the decorations for the Auxiliary luncheon and the Association all units dinner at the 1996 MS NG NCO Association Conference held in Tupelo, MS. Delores often used her gift for crafting to assist with Auxiliary projects.

Over the years, Delores performed many installation services, both at the state and national level. Delores also served as parliamentarian.

Delores served numerous times as District IV Junior and District IV Senior Director and served on a variety of Mississippi & EANGUS Auxiliary committees.

Delores received The NCO Wife of the Year Award in 1974 and The President's Trophy in 1980.

I know that every past president of the Mississippi and EANGUS Auxiliary has warm memories of Delores. She was a gracious Southern lady who was always willing to help in any way she could. Her love for her Savior shone through in her daily life. She was certainly special to me!

Senior Corner: Brooks Marr Senior Contributor**Subject: Advice from Snopes**

By now, I suspect everyone is familiar with www.snopes.com and/or www.truthorfiction.com for determining whether information received via email is just that: true/false or fact/fiction. Both are excellent sites. Below is their advice for us.

Advice from www.Snopes.com

1) Any time you see an E-Mail that says forward this on to '10' of your friends, sign this petition, or you'll get bad luck, good luck, or whatever, it almost always has an E-Mail tracker program attached that tracks the cookies and E-Mails of those folks you forward to. The host sender is getting a copy each time it gets forwarded and then is able to get lists of 'active' E-Mails addresses to use in SPAM E-Mails, or sell to other spammers.

2) Almost all E-Mails that ask you to add your name and forward on to others are similar to that mass letter years ago that asked people to send business cards to the little kid in Florida who wanted to break the Guinness Book of Records for the most cards. All it was, and all any of this type of E-Mail is, a way to get names and 'cookie' tracking information for telemarketers and spammers - - to validate active E-Mail accounts for their own profitable purposes.

You can do your friends and family members a GREAT favor by sending this information to them; you will be providing a service to your friends, and will be rewarded by not getting thousands of spam E-Mails in the future!

If you have been sending out (FORWARDING) the above kinds of E-Mail, now you know why you get so much SPAM!

Do yourself a favor and STOP adding your name(s) to those types of listings regardless how inviting they might sound!

You may think you are supporting a GREAT cause, but you are NOT in the long run. Instead, you will be getting tons of junk mail later! Plus, we are helping the spammers get rich! Let's don't make it easy for them!

Also: E-Mail petitions are NOT acceptable to Congress or any other organization. To be acceptable, petitions must have a signed signature and full address of the person signing the petition.

Myrtle Hollmann (SD) Remembered

Mrs. Myrtle Rose (Wiechmann) Hollmann, age 83, died July 7 at the Wagner Community Memorial Hospital in Wagner, South Dakota. She was preceded in death by her husband, William (Bill). Bill and Myrtle celebrated 60 years of marriage prior to his death in 2006.

Visitation and a prayer service were held on July 9 and the funeral was held on July 10 at the United Methodist Church in Wagner.

Myrtle was born on a farm north of Wagner. She graduated at Ravina Consolidated High School and attended Southern State Normal School where she attained a teaching certificate. She taught country school south of Wagner for 3 years returning to Springfield during the summers to advance her education.

Myrtle and Bill married in May 1946. After spending time in Springfield, MO, with the military, they returned to a farm south of Wagner, where Myrtle continued teaching country school as they started their family. They moved their family into Wagner in 1957. Bill worked for the National Guard while Myrtle stayed home to raise their 8 children (Linda, Ron, Sharleen, Kathy, Lydia, John, Patricia, and Tim). For more than 30 years Myrtle provided childcare for many working families.

Myrtle was a charter member of both the South Dakota Enlisted Association Auxiliary and the EAN-GUS Auxiliary.

Myrtle and Bill enjoyed traveling and rarely missed a National Guard or VFW Convention where they made lifelong friends. Myrtle was a member, held offices, and received awards in the South Dakota National Guard Enlisted Association Auxiliary, VFW Auxiliary, Wagner Hospital Auxiliary, Good Samaritan Auxiliary, and United Methodist Women. Marlys List shared with me that she and Donovan (Don) often traveled with Bill and Myrtle and they were dear and close friends. Myrtle attended the South Dakota Conference in April with Marlys and Don and really enjoyed herself.

Her family stated that Myrtle's greatest joy was having her family together. They remembered her for her love of flowers, meticulous stitching, handwritten correspondence, cooking, and canning. Her apple butter recipe is a family treasure. Myrtle's hands were never idle and her children, grandchildren (15), and great-grandchildren (16) were the recipients of her heartfelt work.
