Legislative Alerts & Updates

The Call: 10-15 Elevating the Chief of the National Guard Bureau to the Joints Chiefs **The Issue:** Elevating the Chief of the National Guard Bureau to a Permanent Seat on the Joint Chiefs of Staff

Immediate Action Required: Contact your Representatives and Senators and ask them to co-sponsor “The Guardians of Freedom Act of 2010,” H.R. 6377 sponsored in the House by Representative Nick Rahall (D-WV) and S. 3931, in the Senate sponsored by Senator Jay Rockefeller (D-WV). These bills would grant the Chief of the National Guard Bureau a permanent seat on the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

The National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008 (Public Law 110-181), brought about historic Empowerment changes for the National Guard, elevating the Chief of the National Guard to the rank of four-star general and providing the Chief a stronger voice inside the Pentagon.

“The Guardians of Freedom Act of 2010,” now being offered, will further strengthen the National Guard’s ability to carry out its dual missions at home and abroad. These bills will improve the quality and timeliness of advice relating to National Guard matters by providing a permanent seat on the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

FREE TUTORING FOR MILITARY FAMILIES

Many active duty and deployed military families in the Army, Marines, Navy, and Air Force are eligible for free access to the Department of Defense online tutoring program with Tutor.com.

Military families who are eligible for the DoD tutoring program:

- U.S. active duty military service members and their dependents.
- U.S. military reservists on active duty in a deployed status and their dependents.
- U.S. National Guard personnel on active duty in a deployed status and their dependents.
- DoD civilians in a deployed status and their dependents.

This program is provided by the Department of Defense. Continued Department of Defense sponsorship of this program is dependent on the availability of DoD funds.

(If you are not eligible for the free military tutoring program, you can purchase a [monthly tutoring plan](#) for your family.)

The Tutor.com for U.S. Military Families program gives eligible military families access to free online tutoring and free homework help from live, professional tutors in more than 16 subjects. Military families who are moving frequently or dealing with a deployed parent can rely on our tutors for expert help staying on top of tonight's homework or catching up on missed concepts and lessons—at no cost.

How do I know if I'm eligible for free online tutoring and homework help?

Many military members and their families are eligible for free homework help and tutoring through the Tutor.com for U.S. Military Families program. Check out the [complete eligibility list](#) to find out if you and your family qualify for free access.

I'm eligible. When can I use the program?

Anytime you need it. Our tutors are online 24/7, and you never need an appointment.

Where do I access the free program?

Everything is online, so you can access the program from any internet-enabled computer worldwide.

Free tutors? Are they qualified to help me?

Absolutely. All our tutors are real people who are expert in the subjects they tutor. They tutor every skill level from elementary to advanced, and they can also help with introductory college courses, adult learning, and career transitions.

How exactly does the tutor help me?

You and the tutor will work together in a secure online classroom, where you can chat, draw on a shared whiteboard, upload files, and browse the web together.

WHY THE AMERICAN FLAG IS FOLDED 13 TIMES

Have you ever noticed on TV or at military funerals that the honor guard pays meticulous attention to correctly folding the American flag 13 times?

I've known how the 21 gun salute was determined (adding the individual digits of 1776), but only recently learned why the flag was folded 13 times when it is lowered or when it is folded and handed to the widow at the burial of a veteran.

HERE IT IS: The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing our ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The fourth fold represents our weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in time of war for His divine guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States Of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood; for it has been through their faith, their love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great has been molded.

The tenth fold is a tribute to the father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

The eleventh fold, in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

The twelfth fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding us of our nation's motto, "In God We Trust". After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for us the rights, privileges, and freedoms we enjoy today. There are some traditions and ways of doing things which have deep meaning. You will see many flags folded in the coming weeks, and now you will know why.
