President Viv's Message

The **Area II Meeting in Baltimore**, Maryland, scheduled for February 5-6 was postponed until March 5-6 due to the winter storm the first of February. The weather on the March 5-7 weekend was lovely... sunny with moderate temps. Jerry and I drove so we again enjoyed seeing the snow left from all the earlier storms through the area from

Lookout Mountain north. We spent Thursday evening in Wytheville, Virginia and discovered The Log House 1776 Restaurant, which is in a Revolutionary War-era log cabin that had been added to in the 1800s. Good food, ambiance, gift shop, and change of pace from chains.

Area II had an excellent meeting moderated by Area II Chair Joe Wade. MDEANGUS hosted the meeting and made us all feel welcome from the time we arrived at the hospitality room on Friday through the end of meeting on Saturday.

The joint session on Saturday was full of Area II business and included an EANGUS update from President Lever as well as voting on updated SOPs for Area II Caucus at EANGUS Conference and Mid-Winter Meeting. I appreciate being allowed a spot on the agenda to remind the EANGUS/Auxiliary members of our initiatives. The Area II Auxiliary had a short breakout where Area II Director Ute Vance met with those Auxiliary members present and updated contact information. Ute is blessed to have Vice-President Jenny Lainhart and Immediate Past President Sheila Bandy in Area II; both were present at the Mid-Winter Meeting and shared advice with Ute and offered their encouragement. Sheila also worked at the EANGUS office a couple of days and visited her Congressmen on Capitol Hill.

The 2011 Area II Mid-Winter Meeting will be held in West Virginia; complete details will be announced at a later date.

Those at the Area II Mid-Winter Meeting were very generous...I sold all the Main Dish Cookbooks I took (18), 5 dessert Cookbooks, and took in \$151 in donations on the amethyst and diamond bracelet. I mailed Cora checks from individuals and a cashier check for cash received on March 9 for a total of \$817—\$280 for a total of 56 Main Dish Cookbooks; \$105 for 21 Dessert Cookbooks; \$10 in donations; \$15 for 3 national associate memberships; and \$407 for donations (tickets) for the amethyst and diamond tennis bracelet. The total represents the amounts received at the 186th ARW Family Day, the MS NG NCO Association Auxiliary Board Meeting in January, and the Areas VI & VII Mid-Winter Meeting in Casa Grande, Area IV Mid-Winter Meeting in Baton Rouge, and the Area II Mid-Winter Meeting in Baltimore.

The Scholarship Committee of EANGUS Auxiliary is accepting applications for the school year 2010-2011. If funds are available, one scholarship in the amount of \$1250.00 will be awarded to the number one ranked applicant and three scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 each will be awarded, one being the scholarship donated by USAA.

1. Please read materials carefully before giving any applications to candidates. Be prepared to give assistance if needed. No previous recipients are allowed to apply again.

2. In order for each application to be considered, it **MUST** contain the following documentation – **NO EXCEPTIONS**.

a. High School/College Transcripts.

b. Three signed Letters of Recommendation

c. Letter from Applicant containing future goals and need for assistance.

d. A Letter of Recommendation and Transmittal from the State Auxiliary President, Scholarship Chairperson or Designee.

3. EANGUS Auxiliary sponsor must have dues paid to National Auxiliary no later than December 31, 2009.

4. For applicants to be eligible, sponsor's State Auxiliary must make a donation to the EANGUS Auxiliary Scholarship Fund for the current and prior year. (Suggested donation is \$2.00 per member annually payable by December 31.)

It will be the responsibility of each State to make the information available to their membership. You may copy the application, however, **DO NOT** reduce it. Each State is to designate a Scholarship Chairperson and the applications returned to that person by a specific date. The application should then be reviewed to ensure all requirements have been met. Any incorrect applications received by the National Committee will be considered ineligible.

The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States Auxiliary Scholarship Awards Program is as follows:

The following persons are eligible:

1. EANGUS Auxiliary Members
2. Unmarried, dependent sons and daughters of EANGUS Auxiliary Members
3. Spouses of EANGUS Auxiliary Members

Verification of membership in the EANGUS Auxiliary of the mother, father, spouse or self is necessary for applicants to be eligible.

For applicants to be eligible, sponsor's State Auxiliary must have made a donation to the EANGUS Auxiliary Scholarship fund for the current year and the prior year. (Suggested amount is \$2.00 per member per year payable by 31 December.)

Applicants must be enrolled at a university, college, business or trade school taking a minimum of eight accredited hours. **Graduate students are not eligible**.

An alternate recipient will be selected in case a recipient is unable to accept the award.

There shall be no consideration whatsoever given by the judges because of rank or grade of applicant, applicant's parents or applicant's spouse.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement, character, leadership and need.

All applications must be accompanied by the following documentation:

1. A transcript of high school credits and/or college credits for applicants already enrolled in institutions of higher learning.
2. Letter from applicant with specific goals to continue his/her education and why financial aid is required.
3. Three **signed** letters of recommendation verifying the application and giving general personal traits. These may be from high school principal, counselor, dean, professor, minister, employer, etc.
4. A letter of recommendation and transmittal from State Auxiliary President, Scholarship Chairperson or Designee.

Checks will be sent directly to the recipient, made payable to the institution of the recipient's choice, when verification of current enrollment is received by the committee chairperson.

These are one-time awards and shall not be repeated. Non-recipients may reapply so long as stated requirements are met. IF the school term is not completed, due to cause other than sickness or injury, the student will refund the scholarship award in full to the EANGUS Auxiliary.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of fund availability for the current year and the number of applicants.

Wasp Spray

A friend who is a receptionist in a church in a high risk area was concerned about someone coming into the office on Monday to rob them when they were counting the collection.

She asked the local police department about using pepper spray and they recommended to her that she get a can of wasp spray instead.

The wasp spray, they told her, can shoot up to twenty feet away and is a lot more accurate, while with the pepper spray, they have to get too close to you and could overpower you. The wasp spray temporarily blinds an attacker until they get to the hospital for an antidote. She keeps a can on her desk in the office and it doesn't attract attention from people like a can of pepper spray would. She also keeps one nearby at home for home protection.

Thought this was interesting and might be of use.

On the heels of a break-in and beating that left an elderly woman in Toledo dead, self defense experts have a tip that could save your life.

Val Glinka teaches self-defense to students at Sylvania Southview High School. For decades, he's suggested putting a can of wasp and hornet spray near your door or bed.

Glinka says, "This is better than anything I can teach them."

Glinka considers it inexpensive, easy to find, and more effective than mace or pepper spray. The cans typically shoot 20 to 30 feet; so if someone tries to break into your home, Glinka says "spray the culprit in the eyes". It's a tip he's given to students for decades.

It's also one he wants everyone to hear. If you're looking for protection, Glinka says look to the spray.

"That's going to give you a chance to call the police; maybe get out." Maybe even save a life.

Please share this with all the people in your life, especially those who are vulnerable or alone.
